

BUSHFIRE EMERGENCY INFORMATION FOR VOLUNTEER & LOCUM VETERINARIANS

At present, only police and emergency services are allowed into many of the affected fire grounds. In the meantime, vets can add their names to volunteer databases for deployment when the authorities deem this to be safe. The situation is slightly different in each state.

Veterinary Registration

National Recognition of Veterinary Registration (NRVR) allows veterinarians **already** registered in Australia to practice immediately in fire affected areas in Queensland, New South Wales, ACT and Victoria. For other states and territories, please contact the veterinary boards directly to check requirements.

New Zealand registered veterinarians may apply to register in all Australian jurisdictions via TTMRA.

For all other veterinarians please consult the document Qualifications recognised by ABVC to ascertain eligibility to apply for registration as a veterinarian in Australia.

NSW

Veterinarians based overseas who are eligible for full or specialist registration in NSW must apply for registration in NSW in order to provide veterinary services in NSW. The Board will waive the registration fee for any veterinarians wishing to provide veterinary services for up to one month in NSW as a volunteer. The registration application fee (\$140) still applies (unless this is a restoration to the Register) and the veterinarian must volunteer their services through the AVERT program to facilitate coordination of this assistance.

VIC

If you wish to register with Vetboard Victoria so you can provide veterinary services during the bushfire emergency, the processing of your registration application can be fast tracked. If you are being paid to provide veterinary services in the emergency, the Board will waive fast track registration fees. If you will not be paid for your services, the Board may consider waiving some registration charges.

Veterinary Nurses

Veterinary nursing volunteers are needed in a range of wildlife rescue organisations.

Insurance

For veterinarians volunteering and/or providing local assistance during bushfires Guild will provide cover for any veterinarians volunteering and/or engaged by a local authority:

- Individual Policy (non-proprietor):
 - Professional indemnity & public/products liability cover provided under the Guild policy for volunteer vets
- Business Insurance Policy (Proprietor):
 - Professional indemnity & public/products liability Guild will provide cover for vets volunteering for an emergency event. For indemnity to be granted the veterinarian (who is an employee and is covered under their employer's business insurance policy) must advise their employer and obtain consent to undertake voluntary work. This may be in the form of a note and/or a call to their employer regarding their voluntary work.
- All Guild-insured veterinarians are advised to speak to their account manager or call Guild directly on 1800 810 213 to have this noted.
